Those are harder to find as they usually (if not always) end with a good guy and a gun. Seek those stories out and look at what they did right. You can learn a lot.

I had noticed their interest in my home by being observant. I paid attention to which cars drove by my house and whether or not they slowed down when they went by (especially if it was at night). They were horrible at concealing their interest and I caught on quickly.

The night they tried to break into my home was one they thought that I was at work. I had stationed myself outside in the shadows and scared them to pieces with a shotgun when they tried to break in. They didn't expect me to be at home at all, let alone sitting outside in the dark.

It doesn't matter who you are, if you have something a bad guy wants they will go after you if they think they can get away with it. I was a deputy and they still targeted me.

Every situation is different. Depending on where you live and what is going on around you will change your weak areas. However, thieves, rapists, murderers, and even mobs can happen anywhere.

Do you know someone who may have a grudge against you? A motive to cause harm is a serious thing to consider. Don't put a blind eye towards any possible threat. If they were to try and harm you (i.e. ex's, coworkers, past employees), what are they likely to do and how are they likely to do it? – Plan accordingly.

Make a list of your weak areas and what your potential dangers are. Use that when planning your home defense strategy. Target your weak areas first and make them strong. (Dummy Check: do **not** to leave those lists where they can be seen by just anyone)

Take your biggest, most unlikely threat and prepare for it like it was going to be there any day.

Being prepared for the worst possible thing makes any threat that may come your way seem easy to deal with.

You are more likely to succeed in your home defense if you have more than one fail safe. Keep in mind that the best of plans go wrong and have a back up strategy to use if that one fails.

Homework

- ▶ Find at least one worldwide information source that you can trust to keep you up to date with current events all over the world
- ▶ Look at countries that have a failing society and where crime runs rampant (what kinds of attacks are the locals experiencing?)
- ▶ Find at least one national information source that you can trust to keep you up to date with current events all through the country
- ▶ Look at events in the country that led to home invasions. Why do you think they were a target and what could they have done to prevent the tragedy?

- ▶ Find at least one local information source that you can trust to keep you up to date with current events near you
- ▶ Look at events near you where someone's home was broken into – what did they do wrong and how could they have prevented it? (Was it a thief, rapist, murderer? Was it someone they knew or a total stranger? How did they get in?)
- ▶ Look at events near you where someone was able to prevent a home invasion. What did they do to stop it – or how was it prevented? (don't hesitate to contact your local sheriff to get this information)
